Partner Spotlight: Swim2Win

Over the past couple of years, **Friends of Islands Initiatives, Inc.** has been proud to provide grants and support to Nevis' Swim2Win program, which provides year-round swim instruction to children and adults of all ages and abilities. Programs and instruction are geared toward improving water safety and life-saving skills, and replacing fear of the water with fun, fitness, and family time whilst promoting a healthy lifestyle through swimming.

FOII caught up with Terri Andrews, developer and director of Swin2Win, to learn more:

Q: What are the origins of the Swim2Win program on Nevis? What is its mission?

A: Swim2Win was created to address the inherent fear of the sea in the Federation. Consistent, standardized instruction that focuses on proper technique is needed in order to reach everyone.

Our mission is to develop a pool of professionally trained local instructors so that swimming can be introduced as part of the school curriculum. In addition, we are committed to reaching fearful adults so that they can enjoy the beaches and sea with their families. Through our partnership with Government, we are establishing international lifeguard certification for local ferry operators, beach lifeguards, and Coast Guard.

Q: How have grants from Friends of Islands Initiatives made a difference in helping Swim to Win achieve and grow its mission?

Our sponsors and supporters are our lifeline! Funding for caps, goggles, instructor rash guards, medals, halyards, swim sponsorships, etc. allow us to offer professional swim instruction for a very reasonable fee and various camps and community instruction programs for FREE. This year's summer swim camp reached over 125 swimmers, 90% of whom had never had a swim lesson!



Q: What are Swim to Win's aspirations for the future, and how will the program continue to support the Nevisian community?

We began two pilot school swim programs in April and will have two additional programs beginning this fall term. Our long-term goal is to have swim instruction become part of every school's curriculum.

With Government and our partnership with Coast Guard, we will establish an authorized training center to continue to train water rescue/lifeguards for our local ferries and beaches.

We are also training an additional 10 instructors so as to have 30 fully trained instructors by the end of the year for our school programs, Saturday and Sunday Swim to Win classes, Community Free Swims, and our Women's Water Retreats.
