Will you join us in reaching our future milestones?





## What Is A Blood Analyzer Machine?

A Hematology Analyzer is a critical and time-saving machine that can count the number of different types of red and white blood cells, blood platelets, hemoglobin, and hematocrit levels in a blood sample.

It provides a more accurate and detailed analysis of samples, which is useful when diagnosing specific conditions. Because it is automated, it saves valuable time in making diagnoses, and thus treatment plans.

Without a new cataract machine, surgeries to address cataracts, glaucoma, and diabetic retinopathy would not be possible during their twice-yearly clinics at the Alexandra Hospital.

With a Master's in Historic Preservation from Goucher College, Suzanne has contributed to a number of consequential Nevis historical preservation efforts, including the creation of accurate signage and interpretive boards at New River and the original Nevis Heritage Trail. As Vice Chair of the Nevis World Heritage Committee, she advocated to have a Nevis site listed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. She has also been involved with the Nevis Historical and Conservation Society for many years as a board member.

Having been a staff writer for the *Philadelphia Inquirer* for more than 15 years, Suzanne has written for Caribbean and international publications and is the author of *Searching for Sugar Mills: An Architectural Guide to the Eastern Caribbean* with architect Anne Hersh. Her activism and generosity to our community earns her our much-valued Donor Spotlight in this edition of the FOIII newsletter.
